Theme: **When the ransom is paid, you are free.**

I. The Passover In Egypt.

1. The Redemptive Work of Christ. (1 Pet. 1:17-21, 2:21-25).
2. The Redeemed People, the Church (Rom. 8:1-15, 1 Pet. 2:9 & 10).

In My Life This Week

(As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.)

Monday. It is significant that the only other time in the Old Testament that the use of the hyssop branch was prescribed was in order to purify or ordain someone or something. If God was setting Israel apart through the Passover, how much more has God done so through the blood of His Son for His church. Take some time to ask God what He has set you apart for in the coming week.

Tuesday. Through the redemption you have in Christ, God has set you free from sin and even from the law. Take a few moments to consider if there are still areas of your life that are ruled by sin or law. How can you take advantage of the freedom you have in Christ in this respect?

Wednesday. On Sunday we examined why God went to the bother of the Passover. We looked at the reason He did this miracle. Now consider why God redeemed you. What was the reason He felt it necessary to send His Son to die a death that was rightfully yours? Thank Him for that today.

Thursday. What is one way that you can encourage another member of the body of Christ today? Maybe a phone call, a note in the mail, or a quick visit? As God's people we all share a common bond in the redemption we have in Christ. Take the time to fellowship with someone else and appreciate how special that bond is and the sacrifice that makes it possible.

Friday/Saturday. On Sunday Pastor Lyle will be continuing our series in Exodus with "Free At Last!" (12:37 – 13:22). Read that section and prepare your heart and mind to consider what God is saying through this Scripture.
