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Remember And Live In ...

Your Deliverance By God.

1. God's promise of deliverance. (3:8-10, 16-18; 6:1, 6-8; cf. Genesis 3:15; 15:13-14; Isaiah 52:13 – 53:12; John 8:36; 10:10)
2. God's action of deliverance. (3:1 f; chapters 5 – 12; 13:3, 9, 14, 16; cf. Psalm 8:3 and Isaiah 52:10; Acts 2:24; Romans 1:4; 1 Corinthians 6:14; Ephesians 1:19-23)
3. Remembering and living in your deliverance. (12:1-28; 13:1-16; cf. 1 Corinthians 11:24-25; Galatians 5:1)

Your Devotion To God.

1. Grounded in His Word. (13:9, 16; cf. Deuteronomy 6:1-9; cf. Romans 6:17-18; 2 Timothy 3:16-17)
2. Flowing from grateful, loving obedience. (13:1-6, 12; cf. Deuteronomy 6:1-5; Joshua 1:1-9; John 14:15)
3. Displayed in individual and corporate lives of worship. (12:42-50; 13:2-10, 11-12, 16, cf. Acts 2:42; 1 Timothy 4:13-16; Hebrews 10:25)

Your Direction From God.

1. God is always with and ahead of us. (13:20-22; cf. Deuteronomy 31:1-8; Joshua 1:1-9; Psalm 139:7-12; Hebrews 13:5-6)

2. God will always lead us. (13:17-22; cf. Psalm 32:8; 33:18; 48:14; Isaiah 58:11; John 16:13)

3. We are to follow God step by step for the entire journey. (13:20-22; cf. Deuteronomy 13:4
Joshua 1:1-9; 14:9)

In My Life This Week

*(As you use this daily guide, write out your observations
and responses on a separate piece of paper and

Monday. Read through Exodus 12:37–13:32 for an overall perspective of Israel’s first steps of freedom. They were free at last! Try to picture yourself as one of them. What thoughts would you have about being spared from during the Passover (12:29-30), about God, the future?

Tuesday. These first steps of freedom teach us lessons about living as people who God has set free. We are to remember and live in His deliverance. Review the outline, references and your notes on this. God bared His holy arm of power in raising Christ from the dead and in saving you. Are you living in spiritual freedom today? Take Galatians 5:1 as your theme for the day.

Wednesday. Living as God’s people freed from the control and domination of sin means remembering and living lives devoted to Him. God set out the Passover and Feast of Unleavened Bread for Israel as a way of remembering what He did for them and as a way to live out, to express their devotion to Him. True devotion is grounded in the truth of God’s Word, evidenced by grateful, loving obedience and displayed in worship. From this perspective, have you been devoted to God this week?

Thursday. Living as God’s freed people means looking for and following His directions. God is always with you and always will lead you as you follow Him. Have there been moments today where you have not been following God’s truth from the Bible and His prompting by the Holy Spirit? If so, get that straight with God now. Get back on track, following Him.

Friday/Saturday. Sunday is Father’s Day. On Sunday Pastor Lyle will speak on “A Father’s Legacy,” based on Proverbs 20:7.

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
