

In My Life This Week

(As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.)

Monday. Read Psalm 111. What do you think it means to praise God with your *whole heart*? How is *whole-hearted* worship different from *half-hearted* (or less) worship? Make sure you praise God with all your heart today.

Tuesday. The psalmist praised God because of who He is and what He does. On the top of a sheet of paper write “I Praise God ...” Then, make two columns: “Because of who He is,” and “Because of What He Does.” Use this as your personal praise list for this week—you can add to it throughout the week.

Wednesday. It now is a couple days after thanksgiving, and you may still be eating turkey leftovers. Are you still thanking and praising God for who and what He is?

Thursday. One of the truths the psalmist stresses is that God, His works and truth are everlasting (e.g., verses 3, 7-8). What does this truth mean to you today?

Friday – Saturday. The psalmist said he would praise God with his whole heart and with God’s people (verse 1). Are you looking forward to worshipping together on Sunday? We return to our series in Job, and will be focusing on how not to comfort from Job’s friends. You can check 2:11-13, scan some of their speeches in chapters 4-27 as well as Job’s comments about them in 13:4, 16:2 and 21:34.
