# The reality of being a servant.

- 1. Everyone serves something or someone. (Matthew 6:24; Romans 6:16; 2 Peter 2:19)
- 2. Believers are "saved to serve." (Romans 6:18-19; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:8-10)
- 3. Believers are gifted, are enabled to serve. (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

## The mindset for serving one another.

- 1. A clear view of yourself—humility. (Romans 12:3, 16; Philippians 2:3-8).
- 2. A clear motive—love. (1 Corinthians 13:1-3; Galatians 5:13-14; Ephesians 4:15)
- 3. A clear view of success—through serving. (Matthew 20:20-28)

### The greatest example for serving one another.

- 1. Jesus in serving His disciples and others. (Matthew 20:28; John 13:1-17)
- 2. Jesus in saving us. (Philippians 2:1-8)

### In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

**Monday.** The Bible instructs us to serve one another—see Galatians 5:13. Review the first point in the outline and any notes you made Sunday about the reality of being a servant. Do you really see yourself as a servant? What, whom are you serving today?

**Tuesday.** Last Sunday we explored some of the mindset needed to truly serve each other aclear view of yourself with humility and love as well as that success comes through serving. Review those points and the Scripture verses on the outline to evaluate where you are at.

**Wednesday.** Jesus is our greatest example — including in serving others. Read John 13:1-17 slowly, carefully. What is Jesus saying to you in these words?

**Thursday.** Jesus' great example of serving us by saving us is described in Philippians 2:1-8. Read these familiar verses thoughtfully. Do you have the same attitude Jesus had when He came to earth (verse 5)? Are you willing to, actually letting go of your rights in order to serve others (verses 6-7)?

**Friday – Saturday.** Sunday we plan to explore admonishing one another. Thank about what *admonishing* means as you prepare for our time together.
