  - covenant and new covenant. (Exodus 19:5; Luke 22:20)
2. Synthesizing the relevant truths.  
(Genesis 15:6; John 1:29; Ephesians 2:8-9; Hebrews 9:11-12; 10:10; 1 Peter 1:18-19)

## God's challenge for Everyone.

1. For Israel then. (24:1-18; see also 20:20)
2. For us today.  
(Deuteronomy 27:10; Matthew 28:20; Luke 14:16-33; John 3:14-16; 14:6, 15; 15:10; Acts 16:31; Romans 3:23; 6:23; 10:9-10; 12:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:3; 1 Peter 3:15)

## **In My Life This Week**

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

**Monday.** Reflect on the Law—What is it? What is its foundation? What is its purpose? Remember also that Exodus 20:22–23:33 is not all of God’s Law. Take the time to read through 20:22–23:33 for perspective on the Law.

**Tuesday.** When we looked at God’s Law for us on Sunday we stated some of the basic relevant truths for determining the place of the Law, and all of God’s Law, in our lives. Why don’t we follow the dietary laws, offer sacrifices, keep all clothing to one kind of material? What can we learn from all of the Law?

**Wednesday.** After God delivered the Law to Israel through Moses, Moses reviewed it with the people as a charge and challenge. God was testing them to see...? (check 20:20; Deuteronomy 13:1-5). What did their response in 24:30 mean, “All the words which the LORD has spoken we will do!”?

**Thursday.** God challenges everyone with His truth with the same issues that were before Israel. The first, as with Adam and Eve in the garden and Abraham is to believe and trust in Him. If you have placed your faith in Christ, are you sharing this challenge with people who have not?

The second challenge is to follow and obey all that He has commanded us, yes, to say and live “All the words which the LORD has spoken we will do!” How are you doing on this, in overall and specific terms?

**Friday/Saturday.** Sunday is Thanksgiving Sunday. We plan to look at giving thanks from Psalm 147. Read the Psalm in preparation for our time of worship together.
